Celebrations

We have had an exciting start to this terms elective cycle, with students taking part in floristry, crotchet, jigsaw puzzles, pickleball, E-Sports and more.

Year 9 and Year 10 Photography students made the most of the sun on Friday by developing their own Cyanotypes. Cyanotype photography is a camera-less technique that involves laying an object on paper coated with a solution of iron salts before exposing it to UV light and washing with water to create stunning white and cyan blue images. Year 9 students used plants and other objects, while Year 10 used a more advanced technique of printing a negative image on acetate which they laid over their coated paper to produce a positive print. Students were very excited by the process and the results.

A group of student visited Plymouth to see Swan Lake at the theatre this week, a wonderful time was had by all and really enjoyed the show.
