Welcome back! It was fantastic to welcome the students back this week. We have hit the ground running this week already...

We have welcomed three of our local primary schools into West Exe this week for our year 4 cross country event organised by our Sarah Blackburn and our own student Sports leaders. It was a great opportunity for our younger community members to take part in a fun, physical activity, whilst getting to know West Exe and our team. We look forward to seeing them all again very soon.

From the moors to the theatre, a group of year 10 and year 11 students travelled to Plymouth on Wednesday evening to see Matthew Bourne's production: Swan Lake. It was a cultural event not to be missed, and all came away inspired by the experience. It was a fantastic opportunity to discuss the creative and artistic decisions made, and how they impact our enjoyment of a familiar tale.

The Ten Tors teams were out last weekend for their introductory walk for the challenge that they will be training for over the next six months. Good luck to them as they build up their strength, stamina and leadership skills, ready for the big event in May.

Looking back into the half-term break, our annual Aspire conference took place on the last Friday of the holiday. It is designed to broaden students' awareness of the opportunities available to them, and to encourage them to have the greatest aspirations for themselves. We welcomed year 10 and 11 students from across Devon to join us for a day of inspirational talks, workshops and interactive tasks and challenges. A great day was had by all.

As part of our ongoing improvement of the school building, various works were done over the summer and half term to improve West Exe for our students and wider community. As part of these works, updates were made to our outdoor sports facilities, a SEND nurture hub was created to host English and Maths recovery sessions and external doors have been re-instated on two of our smaller sets of toilets following student voice to support student comfort and safety. These doors remain open in between lessons. All other toilet facilities have remained unchanged. We were delighted to be able to respond to parent and student feedback and improve our facilities, while ensuring we providinge a wider choice to students of to the type of toilets they would like to use. Staff continue to provide duty cover outside of all toilets to ensure that all children feel safe and able to use the facilities in confidence. While it is fantastic we have been able to respond to you and your childrensome of the initial feedback, we are committed to continuing to improving the school facilities for your children. As such we are investing in a huge refurbishment programme which will commence in later in the year of the summer of 2025. This will allow us to offer brand new bright, fresh and modern toilet facilities. Celebrations

We held our annual Year 4 Cross Country Event at Cowick Barton on the 13, November. Three of our local primary schools took part Exwick Heights, St Thomas and Alphington, with over a 100 keen and eager Year 4 students. We had a glorious day with very impressive individual runs from the primary school students. The morning was organised and officiated by our brilliant WES Sports Leaders who took on the role of race marshals, position and record keepers and pace runners. Well done to all competitors and thank you to our sports leaders, you were all amazing!

Our Y11 public speaking team competed in the first round of the English Speaking Union's Schools' Mace Debating competition. They had to argue in favour of a ban on facial recognition technology, which is not the easiest subject. This involved giving short speeches, answering questions and challenging the points made by the opposition. They were competing against Colyton Grammar, Churston Grammar, Truro School and Blundell's. Our students did brilliantly, and argued their points really well. The judge was very impressed with their performance and selected the West Exe team as one of those to go forward to the next round in January. Congratulations!
