It's early days, but we are seeing signs of improved call handling and a higher pick up rate. Staff training is ongoing and we are enjoying getting to speak to so many more of you.

We're thrilled that you value the wide range of clubs, trips, and activities that we have on offer. This year, we're working to expand opportunities even further.

You also told us that you'd like to know more about how to support home learning. Our team are looking at ways that we can support you with this. At Exeter Athletics RFC, 14 students from Yr 7 & 8 took part in a Rugby tournament hosted by Exeter Chiefs Community. Our students experienced coaching sessions then an afternoon of game play. Some of the girls played full contact rugby & came back covered in mud, but great fun was had by all!

Our 'Wellbeing Champions', Kieran, Harvey, Macie and Lucus received some training through Exeter City Youth Club and learnt about mental health & wellbeing. They then delivered a social action project based around this topic. They have designed a poster to make other students aware of how they can look after their own wellbeing, with the second part of their project based around helping older, more vulnerable members of the community. They designed wellbeing postcards for members of the Exeter City Community Trust Social Café with positive affirmations and well wishes. These were personalised for the café members with drawings of their favourite things. Macie, Lucus and Harvey visited the café in half term and delivered the postcards, chatted to the participants, played games, and helped make the tea and coffee. They are an absolute credit to the youth club and school, and we're really proud of them!

Following their performance in the Exeter Schools XC, five students qualified to represent Exeter in the Exeter v East Devon XC at Blundell's at the end of November. In the usual damp and muddy conditions for a XC, Rhys L and Leo DC ran brilliantly and both finished fourth in their respective races, qualifying for the next round.
